Notes From the Field



Summer is really here on the farm. Around midday we can hear cicadas buzzing in the trees, tomatoes are ripening, and the crop plan reminding us to our plant fall carrots, beets, and cabbage before it gets too late. A few weeks ago harvested our garlic and moved it into

the greenhouse to dry or "cure." After curing for about 2 weeks, the garlic is ready to be cleaned up from a full plant with roots and stem to the bulb you see in the grocery store - one of my absolute favorite farm tasks. We are halfway through our 20 week CSA, and I want to thank our CSA members for their support so far this season. I'd also like to thank the students from Volunteers Around Needham for helping out at the farm two days this month as well as all our new and returning volunteers for all their hard work on the farm.

June was hot, and now July has been the 2nd rainiest on record (so far, as I write this note). On the bright side, with all this rain our direct seeded crops are germinating very well (in plain English that means any seeds we plant directly in the soil are sprouting quickly). However, the rain has waterlogged parts of the farm that don't drain well, and we've lost some crops to root rot and other diseases because of it. All this water is also providing a great test environment for the new drainage we installed last summer in a small section of the farm, generously funded by a Town of Needham CPA grant. The summer squash, peppers, tomatoes, and cabbage in that section are all doing well.

Environmental Advocacy News

There is a tar sands oil pipeline being built through Anishinaabe territory in Minnesota including the headwaters of the Mississippi River. Wild rice, or manoomin, is a sacred food for the Anishinaabe peoples, and their right to it by treaties protected with Government. Line 3's route would impact 389 acres and 17 wild rice water bodies, and would be devastating to a food source already at risk from development and mining, even before the inevitable spills.

Please call President Biden (202-456-1111) and the US Army Corps of Engineers (651-290-5302), and tell them to rescind the permits for Line 3 until these impacts to groundwater and surface water can be assessed.

Summer Internship Independent Projects

We are thankful for the hard work and dedication that our interns have given to the farm this summer. Here is an update on the independent summer projects for both Maddie Bray and Elizabeth Mitas.

Maddie Bray, University of Vermont

For my project with the farm I have decided to create a booklet that outlines the common farm pests and insects that we experience over the course of the summer. I believe this is an important project because these insects can be quite damaging to the farm and to our crops, so if all of our information is united and in one spot, we will be better prepared for when pests present themselves on the farm. The information I hope to present in the booklet will outline defining characteristics of the insects, target crops, life stages and cycles, management techniques, and more. I envision this booklet being used by all who come to the farm: future interns, garden class students, volunteers, etc.

Elizabeth Mitas, Tufts University

For my independent project this summer, I am creating and designing a sign to go outside of the entrance of the farm! The sign will include a description of the farm and what we do, our mission, where the food we produce goes, and our emphasis on food justice — along with pictures to accompany the text. Many people walk by the farm and are curious what our wonderful organization does. The purpose of the new signage is to educate onlookers of what occurs at the farm and give them a sense of what our goals and hopes are for the community we serve. The design application used for this project is Adobe InDesign — a helpful technology for creative projects such as this one.


